Professor Craig will discuss the concepts explored in her forthcoming book, *The End of Sustainability* (co-authored with Melinda Harm Benson). The question she will pose is how American culture and law can better adapt, prepare for, and respond to the

narrative tradition of the Trickster of the Anthropocene. Environmental and natural resources law in the United States assume that natural systems can easily be restored to their proper balance through the application of appropriate assessment and regulation. However, modern ecological studies and resilience theory call these assumptions into doubt, particularly in the face of continually changing ecosystems and baseline conditions brought on by climate change.

This event is free and open to the public and university community and is co-sponsored by the Nebraska Cooperative Fish & Wildlife Research Unit, School of Natural Resources, Department of English, the University of Nebraska Public Policy

Center, and the College of Arts and Sciences through the Thomas C. Sorensen Endowment.


This purpose of the [Open Data and Performance Management website](#) is to give the public better access to City data and
