### Safe2Help Nebraska Releases New Videos Highlighting How and When to Report Concerns



This Summer, the Nebraska Department of Education, Nebraska Council of School Administrators, Boys Town, and the Public Policy Center partnered to develop a series of live-action and animated videos to educate schools, students, and parents about the Safe2Help Nebraska reporting system. The videos will be used by schools to explain how and when to use the reporting system.

### **Emergency Services for Back to School Season**





The training, which presented hypothetical emergency scenarios for the attendees, was facilitated by the **University of Nebraska Public Policy Center** through their partnership with **Nebraska Department of Education**. "We don't want just the schools to be there," says Kurt Mantonya, a research manager at the Public Policy Center.
