Conservation Service chief, recently met
with Dirac Twidwell, professor at the
University of Nebraska–Lincoln, and NUPPC
faculty fellow, to discuss successful
conservation efforts. "Most people know
that land-use conversion was one of the
top drivers of grassland loss last century,"
Twidwell said. "In recent decades, woody
encroachment has emerged as the other
primary driver of grassland loss in the
Great Plains and actually converts as much
grassland every year as row crop
