PPC and Fellows Featured in 2021-22 Nebraska Research Report

Drs. **Mario Scalora** and **Denise Bulling** were featured in the University of Nebraska-Lincoln's (UNL) annual research report for their focus on ***Avoiding School Violence Before It Starts***. They speak about the Center's work involving tipline evaluation and threat assessment training for school teams across Nebraska in a collaborative effort with **Nebraska Department of Education**. In addition to this highlight, the following NUPPC faculty fellows were also featured:

- Craig Allen and team are ***Exploring Ag, Climate Resilience Through Collaboration*** on a larger scale than ever before.

Preparing UNMC Nurses for Suicide Prevention



A UNMC nursing student-led pilot program equipped future nurses with the skills to help prevent suicides and spread information about the 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline. **Quinn Lewandowski** and **Mike Schiwart** recently assisted in the project and trained 77 third-semester nurses in QPR (Question, Persuade, Refer) at the

University of Nebraska Medical Center as part of the program. The QPR training received great feedback from the nursing students and spread awareness of the 988 Lifeline throughout the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Campus.
