The Public Policy Center's Impact in 2025




Each January, we take a look back at the impact we've had around the state during the previous year. In 2025, our team was hard at work on a variety of projects around the state. Here are just a few highlights of those impacts:

- 44 proposals submitted (11 additional in development)
- 34 projects awarded
- 100 projects supported
- Projects reaching 93 Nebraska counties
- 5,596 participants in continuing education trainings
- 116 continuing education credits awarded
- 7,372 educators trained in suicide safe schools

The Nebraska Suicide Deaths Dashboard is now available online!

Developed in partnership with Nebraska DHHS Division of Public Health through the Nebraska Violent Death Reporting System (NEVDRS), this interactive dashboard provides a demographic overview of suicide deaths in Nebraska and allows users to explore trends by year, sex, race and ethnicity, age range, education level, and geography. The dashboard is designed to support data-to-action suicide prevention planning, decision-making, and public awareness efforts across the state.
