City of Lincoln Pilots New 911/988 Partnership to Enhance Mental Health Crisis Response



This month, Mayor Leirion Gaylor Baird announced a new partnership between the Lincoln Emergency Communications Center (LECC) 911 services and the 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline. The partnership will improve mental health support for community members while more efficiently using City of Lincoln government resources. Lincoln is the first city in Nebraska to establish a 911/988 partnership. This collaborative effort included the City of Lincoln, Lincoln

Police Department, Lincoln Emergency Communications 911 Center, University of Nebraska Public Policy Center, Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services, and the Nebraska 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline operated by Boys Town Nebraska.
