
Carrick Detweiler Receives NU Faculty Innovation Award

Interim President Chris Kabourek announced the 2024 recipients of the University of Nebraska **President's Excellence Awards**. The awards honor faculty whose work in teaching, research, engagement, or

commercialization has had a significant impact on students, the university, and the state.

Dr. Carrick Detweiler, has been awarded the Faculty IP Innovation and Commercialization Award (FIPICA), which recognizes faculty members who have developed and nurtured significant new intellectual property from concept to licensing/startup business. Dr. Detweiler is the Susan J. Rosowski Professor in the Department of Computer Science and Engineering at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, faculty fellow of the Robert B. Daugherty Water for Food Institute, faculty fellow of the University of Nebraska Public Policy Center, and co-director of the NIMBUS Lab. Dr. Detweiler's research is focused on developing systems and software to enable interactions of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) with water, fire, and crops.

Hoffman Speaks to Lancaster County Justice Council



Dr. Stacey Hoffman presented at the Lancaster County Justice Council meeting about the University of Nebraska Public Policy Center's multi-year evaluations of the Lancaster County Adult Drug Court and Veterans Treatment Court, diversion courts with the goal of helping people with behavioral health issues get treatment rather than ending up in long-term incarceration. The PPC examines court operations, data, and feedback from court participants to inform changes and updates to court programs.

Publication Focuses on New Theory of Trust



A recent publication by **Dr. Lisa PytlikZillig** and her coauthors appeared in the journal of *Group & Organization Management*. The article titled "The Perceived Influence Model of Trust: Toward a Multi-Trustee Theory" aims to fill an important gap in the literature pertaining to pervasive, but rarely considered, multi-trustee situations, and proposes the importance of trustor perceptions of trustee influence and task requirements for future models of trust.
