Nebraska Disaster Behavioral Health Exercise Helps Agencies Prepare for Floods and Other Disasters

On July 23, 2025, the Public Policy Center facilitated the 22nd Annual Nebraska Disaster Behavioral Health Exercise. The topic and format of this exercise varies from year to year to continually test and identify improvements to the disaster behavioral health preparedness and response capabilities statewide. This year's exercise included discussion in the context of a flood impacting the state of Nebraska and asked participating agencies to assess whether their plans and procedures would be effective at addressing this event. Attendees of this year's exercise represented state agencies, behavioral health regions, local public health departments, emergency management agencies, healthcare

Behavioral Health Trainings Available Online

Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services contracts with the University of Nebraska Public Policy Center to coordinate, prioritize, and provide virtual training and continuing education for behavioral health clinicians and peer support workers across Nebraska. Since 2020, we have coordinated 59 training sessions for behavioral health providers and peer support workers to over 7,667 participants, covering topics such as enhancing peer support



through crisis management, motivational interviewing techniques, and person-centered and trauma-informed crisis management and de-escalation. The response from the behavioral health community has been positive and the trainings are consistently well-attended, averaging over 180 attendees per training. Additional Nebraska Educators to be Trained on Psych First Aid for Schools

Through a partnership between NUPPC



and the Nebraska Department of Education, Drs. Melissa Brymer and Kristine Louie trained a cohort of 15 Psychological First Aid for Schools (PFA-S) trainers who in turn train Nebraska K-12 educators and school crisis teams. This evidence informed practice standardizes the way schools respond to the emotional aftermath of emergencies, tragedies, and disasters. This project is funded by a Mental Health Awareness Training (MHAT) grant from the Center for Mental Health Services, SAMHSA. With the help of the grant, 250 educators and staff will be trained across the state.
